The course assists students in acquiring skills for speaking, reading, and writing the language. Topics of discussion sensitize students to the culture and customs of the Anishinaabe people. This course is intended for students with no previous knowledge of the Anishinaabe language.</p> <p>Qualifications: Excellent competency in Anishinaabemowin and competency with the written language, including familiarity with Anishinaabemowin grammar structures and the double vowel system, is required. Experience teaching language is required, with experience in immersion teaching and/or culture-based education. Ability to teach at a distance and for</p>
